## **Tutor for Graduate Students**

The Tutor for Graduates is Professor Eamonn Gaffney (<a href="tutor.graduates@bnc.ox.ac.uk">tutor.graduates@bnc.ox.ac.uk</a>). Professor Gaffney is available for consultation (in confidence) about any matter, whether academic, personal or financial, and he offers scheduled individual appointments in College at times that will be included in the HCR weekly events email information. However, often your College Advisor, whose academic field will normally be closer to your own, will be the more appropriate first port of call.

## **College Advisors**

The College assigns each graduate student a personal College Advisor. You will be notified of the name of your College Advisor when you arrive. Please do not wait for your advisor to make contact – do write to introduce yourself as soon as possible. While your College Advisor is not intended to replace or supplement the supervision arranged by your Faculty or Department, he or she will take an interest in your academic progress and may be regarded as a useful source of advice about any academic or non-academic matter. In particular, you are encouraged to contact your advisor if you have difficulties with your supervision that cannot be resolved easily by the relevant Director of Graduate studies or encounter any other academic problems (including Faculty or Departmental difficulties, should you have any).

## **Hulme Common Room (HCR)**

The Hulme Common Room, usually abbreviated to "HCR", describes the College's graduate community and is also the name given to a dedicated social space available for the exclusive use of graduates. The HCR Committee (elected from among the student body) are putting together a timetable of welcome events to help you to settle in.
